## Health Insurance for positive people?

On the 7<sup>th</sup> October, district network presidents will hear at first hand about a scheme about to be launched in Maharashtra which will give the opportunity for HIV+ people to take out health insurance.

Ravi Subbiah, a Team Leader from Population Services International (PSI), visited NMP+ recently to talk to Manoj Pardesi and Kishor Sanas about the possibilities.

PSI, which is a non-governmental organisation based in Chennai, negotiated with insurance company Star Health and Allied Insurance to work out a scheme for positive people. It has been trialled in Karnataka, and now the scheme is to be offered in Maharashtra.

Letters went from NMP+ to MSACS, then the National AIDS Control Society, protesting at this.

MSACS has now relented and the job will be re-advertised without the offending restriction.
