## Computer Management Information System

A huge effort from all the districts and the positive living centres, working with NMP+ ACT staff, saw the addition of three years worth of data to the CMIS database completed this month.

This new data will ensure much speedier retrieval of information in the future.

#### Population Foundation of India helps us

A PFI financed workshop trained treatment outreach workers (TOW) who will give information materials in Marathi to peer treatment educators in each district. Big bags of materials, dealing with treatment adherence and other topics were distributed. On the second day, the TOWs were trained in the new Star Health Insurance.

Also during a busy month, there was an INP+ sponsored Finance workshop for all districts, 34 boards were represented, 98 members trained in all.


#### **CHAHA** informs and entertains
